I can't express in words how astonishingly beautiful was Lois Miller's slide show of her bird photographs. Her knowledge of the natural world around us is deep and highly tuned to the life and habits of the amazing diversity of birds on the southern coast. We learned there are 396 different birds that can be found here throughout the year. Lois has photographed 254 of them. She knows them all by name and has captured their portraits in exquisite beauty.



When she is not working at the hardware store she is out observing Garrison Lake with her camera, or watching at the dock or beach or Hubbard's Creek, even photographing the many birds that visit her yard. About sharing her photography and the time and patience it requires, she said "If I can get even one person to look up and see a new bird in their

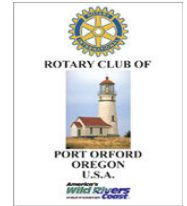
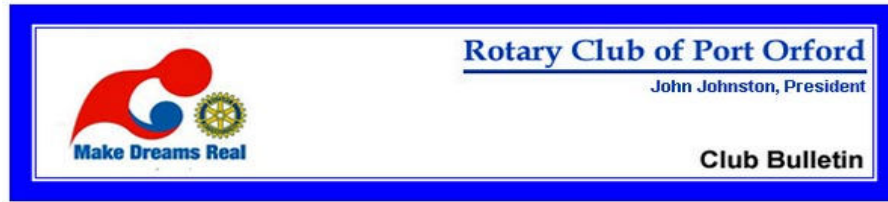
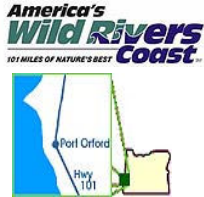
**\*WEDNESDAY TENNIS**
